Take all reasonably practicable steps to meet the requirements of the HSWA (2015), the ACOP for Safety and Health in Forest Operations (2012), and all other relevant guidance



Provide sufficient and suitable information, training & supervision to employees so they are competent and fit to perform their jobs safely and in good health (or are being trained while under supervision)



Proactively identify hazards, assess risk, and put effective controls in place to reduce risk so far as is reasonably practicable



Support efforts to develop and implement new methods, procedures and technologies that have the potential to improve safety



Allocate appropriate resources to health and safety management & clearly define roles and responsibilities, to encourage accountability



Establish, maintain and review our health and safety management system to ensure that we set targets, measure our performance and are continuously improving



Integrate health and safety into our day-to-day practices



Recognise good health and safety practices



Ensure high levels of consultation, cooperation and coordination with all stakeholders



Encourage worker participation by openly communicating and consulting with workers on health and safety matters



Seek assurance that our contractors' activities, systems and performance are ensuring the health and safety of all people who work on or visit our workplaces



Create a culture where incidents and near hits are reported, investigated and shared openly to prevent reoccurrence

Individuals will take responsibility for their own safety and communicate any hazards that they identify. Every person has the right to refuse to perform unsafe work. We are collectively and individually responsible for the health and safety of all people who work in or visit our forests or office. All TPFL employees will take a leadership role in to ensure exceptional health and safety practices at our workplaces.
